Ten Elite Schools Where Middle-Class Kids Don't Pay Tuition

Students lucky enough to be accepted to some of the most competitive schools in the country can save hundreds of thousands of dollars on tuition

In a trend that's bound to come as a relief to parents of high school seniors facing sticker prices that approach \$63,000 a year, a growing number of Ivy League and elite colleges are making college more affordable for middle-class families.

Stanford University announced last week that, starting this fall, students whose families make less than \$125,000 a year will not pay any tuition. Previously, the school had set the bar at \$100,000. With the move, Stanford has made it possible for more middle-class students to get a

degree for what they'd spend in tuition at an in-state, public university (students with a family income above \$65,000 a year still have to cover room and board). That makes an admissions offer that's already among the most coveted in the country even more attractive.

Stanford is not the first elite school to slash tuition for middle-class and upper-middle-class students. (For reference, we're going by the Pew Research Center's definition, which calls a family of three in the U.S. middle class if they made between \$40,667 and \$122,000 in 2013.) While the wealthiest schools have long covered nearly all costs for their poorest students, Harvard since 2004 has steadily broadened the group of students to whom it gives financial aid, putting pressure on its peers to match its generous discounts. The aid programs have helped absorb some of the sticker shock from continuously rising tuition. Take a look at the top schools that students from a range of middle-class families can attend, tuition-free:

***Below information has been updated by presenter:

1. Princeton

Tuition for 2018-19: \$49,450

Acceptance rate for the Class of 2019: 6.99 percent

Policy: Families with incomes ranging from \$0- \$65,000 a year qualify for a grant that covers full tuition, residential college fee, room, or board.

2. Brown

Tuition for 2018-19: \$55,466

Acceptance rate for the Class of 2019: 8.5 percent

Policy: Families making less than \$100,000 don't pay tuition, room, or board.

3. Cornell

Tuition for 2018-19: \$55,188

Acceptance rate for the Class of 2019: 14.9 percent

Policy: Families making less than \$60,000 & total assets of less than \$100,000(including primary home equity) will have no parent contribution or loans.

4. Columbia

Tuition for 2018-19: \$59,430

Acceptance rate for the Class of 2019: 6.1 percent

Policy: Families making less than \$60,000 don't pay tuition, room, or board. For families with incomes ranging from \$60,000-\$100,000 the college offers a significantly reduced parent contribution.

5. Duke

Tuition for 2018-19: \$55,695

Acceptance rate for the Class of 2019: 11.3 percent

Policy: Families making less than \$60,000 don't pay tuition, room, or board.

6. Harvard

Tuition for 2018-19: \$46,340

Acceptance rate for the Class of 2019: 5.3 percent

Policy: Families making less than \$65,000 a year don't pay tuition, room, or board. Families with income ranging from \$65,000-\$150,000 will typically contribute 0-10% of their income.

7. Yale

Tuition for 2019-20: \$55,500

Acceptance rate for the Class of 2019: 6.5 percent

Policy: Families making less than \$65,000 a year don't pay tuition, room, or board.

8. Stanford

Tuition for 2018-19: \$51,354

Acceptance rate for the Class of 2019: 5.05 percent

Policy: Families making less than \$65,000 a year don't pay tuition, room, or board, and families making between \$65,000 and \$125,000 a year don't pay tuition.

9. MIT

Tuition for 2018-19: \$51,520 (includes mandatory fees)

Acceptance rate for the Class of 2019: 8 percent

Policy: Families making less than \$90,000 a year don't pay tuition.

10. Dartmouth

Tuition for 2018-19: \$53,496

Acceptance rate for the Class of 2019: 10.3 percent

Policy: Families making less than \$100,000 don't pay tuition.

Top Ten Student Financial Aid & Higher Education Reminders

1. The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) & your state aid application (example- NYS Tuition Assistance Program (TAP)) is available to complete annually on October 1st.
2. The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) must be completed before your state aid application.
3. In order to electronically sign your FAFSA you must create a FSA ID: <https://fsaid.ed.gov/npas/index.htm>
4. It is NEVER too early to begin searching & applying for scholarships for colleges.
5. When looking at colleges a student should have 3 majors that they are interested in. The student should make sure that all of the colleges that they are interested in have those majors. Once decided as long as you like the college you will not have to transfer if you change majors.
6. Males between the ages of 18-26 are required by federal law to register for Selective Service.
7. Small scholarship awards add up so don't disregard them as not applications to NOT apply for.
8. The Federal Work Study program does indeed require that you work on or off campus in an approved work study job.
9. If a student does not wish to take out a loan during their enrollment in college then they must do the following to complete payment: apply for a payment plan with the Bursar/Student Accounts or Business Office; use a credit card or cash.
10. High School Seniors within New York State can attend College Goal NY events (annually) where they will be assisted by Student Financial Aid professionals with the completion of their FAFSA & TAP applications. <https://collegegoal.ny.gov/program-info>

What is the definition of an independent student?

Because the EFC formula for a dependent student uses parental data and the two formulas for independent students do not, the first step in calculating a student's EFC is to determine his or her dependency status. For the 2020–2021 Award Year, a student is automatically determined to be independent for federal student aid if he or she meets one or more of the following criteria:

- The student was born before January 1, 1997.
- The student is married or separated (but not divorced) as of the date of the application.
- At the beginning of the 2020–2021 school year, the student will be enrolled in a master's or doctoral degree program (such as MA, MBA, MD, JD, PhD, EdD, or graduate certificate, etc.).
- The student is currently serving on active duty in the U.S. Armed Forces or is a National Guard or Reserves enlistee called into federal active duty for purposes other than training.
- The student is a veteran of the U.S. Armed Forces (see the definition in the box on page 4).
- The student has or will have one or more children who receive more than half of their support from him or her between July 1, 2020 and June 30, 2021.
- The student has dependent(s) (other than children or spouse) who live with him or her and who receive more than half of their support from the student, now and through June 30, 2018.
- At any time since the student turned age 13, both of the student's parents were deceased, or the student was in foster care or was a dependent or ward of the court.
- As determined by a court in the student's state of legal residence, the student is now, or was upon reaching the age of majority, an emancipated minor (released from control by his or her parent or guardian).
- As determined by a court in the student's state of legal residence, the student is now, or was upon reaching the age of majority, in legal guardianship.
- On or after July 1, 2019, the student was determined by a high school or school district homeless liaison to be an unaccompanied youth who was homeless or was self-supporting and at risk of being homeless.
- On or after July 1, 2019, the student was determined by the director of an emergency shelter or transitional housing program funded by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development to be an unaccompanied youth who was homeless or was self-supporting and at risk of being homeless.
- At any time on or after July 1, 2019, the student was determined by a director of a runaway or homeless youth basic center or transitional living program to be an unaccompanied youth who was homeless or was self-supporting and at risk of being homeless.
- The student was determined by the college financial aid administrator to be an unaccompanied youth who is homeless or is self-supporting and at risk of being homeless.

For students who do not meet any of the above criteria but who have documented unusual circumstances, an FAA can override their dependency status from dependent to independent. For information about dependency overrides, see the Application and Verification Guide, which is part of the Federal Student Aid Handbook and can be found on the IFAP Web site.
